In Book IV, Chapter xi of Locke's *Essay Concerning Human Understanding*, Locke answers someone who is "so sceptical as to distrust his senses, and to affirm that all we see and hear, feel and taste, think and do, during our whole lifetime is nothing but a long dream with no reality in it." Summarise what Locke says to this person, in your own words.
